GENERAL BID INFORMATION

1. **INTENT**

The City of Beaumont is requesting bids for a **six (6) month contract to provide certain automotive lubricants** for use by the City.

2. **CONTRACT TERM**

- 2.1 This contract shall be in effect for a period of six (6) months beginning within thirty (30) days following award by the Beaumont City Council.
- 2.2 Price shall be firm for not less than six (6) months from date of award.
- 2.3 At the end of the initial term, the City may renew this contract for two (2) additional six (6) month periods at the price quoted.
- 2.4 There shall be no increase in price should an extension be granted.
- 2.5 Any terms and conditions stated in original specifications will apply to any extended periods.
- 2.6 Approval on behalf of the City to renew this contract shall be made by the City Manager or his designee.
- 2.7 No minimum or maximum quantities of work are guaranteed.
- 2.8 This contract may be canceled by either party by providing written notice at least thirty (30) days in advance.

3. **BID DUE DATE**

BIDs are due no later than 2:00 P.M. (CT), THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2026.

5.5 BID items CANNOT be altered. If Bidder needs to include additional information, it is to be provided on a separate sheet, with the number of the bid included, as well as the bidder's company name. Bidders may upload separate sheet(s) to the e-bid site at: <https://beaumonttexas.ionwave.net/Login.aspx> under the Response Attachments tab.

5.6 All required online entries and required uploaded documents MUST be submitted for bid to be considered. Failure to do so may result in bid rejection due to non-response.

5.7 Certifications, where required, shall accompany the bid submission. They may be uploaded under the Response Attachments tab.

5.8 Bids are to be submitted through online e-bids items only. Oral, telegraphic, e-mail or telephone bids or modifications will not be considered.

5.9 Failure to comply with information requested on any of these items will result in disqualification of the bid.

6. QUESTIONS

Specific questions concerning items or procedures in this solicitation, shall be submitted on <https://beaumonttexas.ionwave.net/Login.aspx>. Questions will be answered through an Addendum and posted on the IONWAVE site. Vendors who received notification of the bid opportunity will be notified of the Addendum via email.

Questions received less than seven (7) calendar days prior to the date of opening bids may not be answered. Only questions that have been resolved by formal written addenda will be binding. Oral and other interpretations or clarifications will be without legal effect.

7. COMMUNICATIONS PERTAINING TO BID/RFP

Bidders/Proposers shall not attempt to directly contact City Council members, management, or CITY staff other than the contact person listed within this bid/RFP document, during the pre-proposal or post-proposal period unless and until award has been made, and any resulting contract or agreement has been executed. The CITY intends to respond to all appropriate questions or concerns; however, the CITY reserves the right to decline to respond to any questions or concerns. All material modifications, clarifications or interpretations will be incorporated into an addendum which will be publicly posted. All addenda issued prior to the due date and time for responses are incorporated into the bid/RFP and must be acknowledged in the bid/proposal response. Only the written information provided shall be binding. Oral or other interpretations shall not be binding and are held without legal effect.

8. **NO PERSON** has the authority to verbally alter these specifications. Any changes to specifications will be made in the form of an Addendum which will be made available online at <https://beaumonttexas.ionwave.net/Login.aspx>. Vendors who received notification of the RFP opportunity will be notified of the Addendum via email.
9. All mathematical calculations will be verified. In the event of an error by Proposer, City calculation shall be considered correct. In the event of discrepancies, the unit price stated by vendor shall be considered the bid price.
10. The City reserves the right to accept or reject any response or combination of responses deemed advantageous to it.

11. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER

The successful Proposer shall warrant and agree that he/she is an Equal Opportunity Employer. Should complaints of any form of discrimination, either in dispensation of the service, or within company hiring policies be substantiated, this contract may be terminated immediately.

12. H.B. 1295 COMPLIANCE
Texas Ethics Commission Certificate Number

The Awarded Vendor for the contract shall comply with the requirements of Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code as adopted in 2015 as House Bill 1295. The law requires that a governmental entity may not enter in certain contracts with a business entity unless the business entity submits a Disclosure of Interested Parties to the governmental entity. The law applies only to a contract that either (1) requires an action or vote by the governing body of the entity or agency before the contract may be signed or (2) has a value of at least \$1 million.

Compliance with the law requires that the awarded Vendor utilize the Texas Ethics Commission website to enter the required information on Form 1295 and print a copy of the complete form. The form must be signed, notarized and submitted to the contracting government entity.

The City of Beaumont, in the case of contracts formalized by Purchase Order or by other written contract, will notify the Vendor of Award by Council and request the completed Form 1295 within five (5) working days thereafter.

13. H.B. 89 COMPLIANCE
Verification –

The Awarded Vendor for the contract shall comply with the requirements of Senate Bill 252 Ch. 2252 Certification: Texas Government Code, Chapter 2252, Section 2252.152 and Section 2252.153 of the Texas Government Code as adopted in 2017 as House Bill 89 (HB89).

The law requires that a governmental entity may not enter in certain contracts with a business entity unless the business entity submits an executed HB89 Compliance form to the governmental entity.

Compliance with the law requires that the awarded Vendor complete the form and submit with bid or proposal. The form must be signed, notarized and submitted to the contracting government entity.

14. LOCAL VENDOR PREFERENCE

The Texas Local Government Code, Sections 271.905(a) and 271.9051 allow the City to consider a vendor's principal place of business in awarding certain contracts by way of competitive bids. This consideration is in effect to promote economic development opportunities through the

contract by employing local residents and increasing tax revenue. If you are a Beaumont vendor and wish to be considered for application of this preference, fill in the forms at the end of this package and return with your bid.

15. AWARD OR REJECTION OF BIDS

- 15.1 This contract will be awarded to one (1) Contractor or split between a combination of bidders, as is deemed most advantageous to the City. The Contractor may not assign or subcontract any part of the contract without the prior written agreement from the City.
- 15.2 The City reserves the right to waive Bid or Proposal informalities, to reject any or all Bids or Proposals, and to award to the most responsible Bidder or Proposer making the most satisfying offer to the City.
- 15.3 The contract will be awarded to the responsible Bidder or Proposer having sufficient ability to perform the contract.
- 15.4 The contract may be awarded either to the lowest responsible bidder or to the bidder who provides goods or services at the best value for the municipality.
- 15.5 In determining the best value for the municipality, the municipality may consider:
 - 15.5.1 the purchase price;
 - 15.5.2 the reputation of the bidder and of the bidder's goods and services;
 - 15.5.3 the quality of the bidder's goods and services;
 - 15.5.4 the extent to which the goods or service meet the municipality's needs;
 - 15.5.5 the bidder's past relationship with the municipality;
 - 15.5.6 the impact on the ability of the municipality to comply with laws and rules relating to contracting with historically underutilized businesses and non-profit organization employing persons with disabilities;
 - 15.5.7 the total long-term cost to the municipality to acquire the bidder's goods or services; and
 - 15.5.8 any relevant criteria specifically listed in the request for bids or proposals.

16. WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS OR PROPOSALS

- 16.1 Any bidder may withdraw his bid, either personally or by written request, at any time prior to scheduled time for opening bids.
- 16.2 No bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of sixty (60) days after the date set for opening thereof, and all bids shall be subject to acceptance by the City during this period.

17. BID TABULATION

Bid Tabulation will be available on the City of Beaumont e-bids platform at: <https://beaumonttexas.ionwave.net/Login.aspx>. Bid tabulations will not be provided via any other means. Furnishing of tabulations prior to Council action or by means other than City e-bids platform is not authorized.

18. EXPERIENCE AND CAPABILITY

Bidder shall include the following information to describe the experience and capability of the company:

- 18.1 Kind of company, i.e., corporation, partnership or sole proprietor. If corporation, please list names and addresses of three top corporate officers. If partnership, please list name and addresses of partners.
- 18.2 Number of years in operation.
- 18.3 Gross revenues of past two (2) years.
- 18.4 Largest dollar amount of contract currently in effect with a business.
- 18.5 Number of employees currently employed.
- 18.6 Provide any information concerning any judgments, disbarments, probations, claims, arbitration proceedings or suits filed as a result of contracts performed.
- 18.7 Has your organization ever failed to complete any work awarded to it?
- 18.8 References from at least three (3) customers with whom your company has current or past contracts of similar size. Name, address, phone number and a contact person shall be stated for each reference.

19. INCURRING COSTS

The City of Beaumont is not liable for any costs incurred in replying to this Bid or Proposal.

20. LIABILITY

THE CONTRACTOR AGREES TO INDEMNIFY, DEFEND AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY OF BEAUMONT AND ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, AND EMPLOYEES FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, CAUSES OR ACTION, AND DAMAGES OF EVERY KIND, FOR INJURY TO OR DEATH OF ANY PERSON AND DAMAGES TO PROPERTY ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE WORK DONE BY THE CONTRACTOR UNDER THIS CONTRACT, AND INCLUDING ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THE CITY OF BEAUMONT OR ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES IN CONNECTION WITH SAID CONTRACT. THE PARTIES INTEND THIS INDEMNIFICATION TO APPLY REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE CLAIM, DAMAGE, LOSS, OR EXPENSE IS CAUSED, OR ALLEGED TO BE CAUSED, IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE SUBCONTRACTOR OR ANY INDEMNITEE.

Contractor waives all rights of recovery, and its insurers also waive all right of subrogation of damages against the City and its agents, officers, directors and employees for damages covered by the workers' compensation and employers' liability or commercial umbrella or excess liability or business automobile coverage obtained by Contractor required in this Agreement, where permitted by law. This waiver must be stated on the City's approved Certificate of Insurance.

The fact that insurance is obtained by Contractor on behalf of City will not be deemed to release or diminish the liability of Contractor, including, without limitation, liability under the indemnity provisions of this Agreement. Damages recoverable by City from Contractor or any third party will not be limited by the amount of the required insurance coverage.

21. INVOICES

21.1 Payment by City to Vendor shall be made in accordance with the requirements of Texas Government Code §2251.021.

21.2 Invoices **must** reference a Purchase Order number, Work Order number, and the Department or Division for which goods or services are provided. If provided for a specific vehicle, the invoice must also reference the vehicle ID number.

- 21.3 The Vendor shall submit an accurate invoice within five (5) working days from the date of delivery of goods or services. Failure to do so will be equivalent to non-delivery and may be cause for termination of the contract.

- 21.6 Faxed invoices will not be accepted.
- 21.7 It is the Vendor's responsibility to obtain a purchase order number AND City Department for invoices. This information MUST be included on invoices. Any invoicing received by the City without this correct information may not be paid.

22. FUNDS FOR PAYMENT

Funds for payment are provided by the City of Beaumont budget approved by City Council for the current budget year only. The State of Texas statutes prohibit the obligation and expenditure of public funds beyond the fiscal year for which a budget has been approved. Obligations beyond the end of the current City of Beaumont fiscal year will be subject to budget approval.

23. CONTRACT TERMINATION

The City, besides all other rights or remedies it may have, shall have the right to terminate this agreement upon fifteen (15) days' written notice from the City Manager or his designee, of its election to do so, or if the successful bidder or proposer fails to perform the services or breaches this agreement, including the following:

- 23.1 By failing to pay insurance premiums, liens, claims or other charges.
- 23.2 By failing to pay any payments due the City, State, or Federal Government from the successful bidder or its principals, including, but not limited to, payments identified in this Agreement or any taxes, fees, assessments, or liens.
- 23.3 Upon the institution of voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy proceedings against the successful bidder or upon dissolution of the firm or business.
- 23.4 By violation of any provision or non-performance of the Agreement.

- 23.5 By death of the Contractor, or dissolution of the Contracting firm or business.
- 23.6 By failing to start and or complete assigned work within the agreed upon schedule.
- 23.7 By the abandonment of the premises or any portion thereof and discontinuance of the Contractor's operations, or any portion thereof. Should this occur, the City shall not be responsible for the custodial protection of merchandise, fixtures, or equipment abandoned, even though it is necessary for the City to remove the same for storage or disposal.
- 23.8 In the event the City calls for a mandatory evacuation due to a storm or other emergency, the Contractor shall cease all work at the facility. Upon the removal of the evacuation order, the Contractor has two (2) business days to contact the Purchasing Department at (409) 880-3720 for instructions and authorization to resume services at the facility.

BID SPECIFICATIONS

1. QUANTITIES

The quantities of lubricants shown on the bid sheet as required for the period covered by the bid are *approximate amounts only* and are to be used only for calculation of total bid. The quantities are determined from past purchasing history and, as far as can be determined, are realistic. However, the Purchaser will not be obligated to purchase the quantities shown from the supplier.

2. DELIVERY LOCATIONS

The City shall have the right to add or remove delivery locations within the city limits during the course of this contract. All products shall be delivered F.O.B. to the following locations:

3. TIMING OF DELIVERIES

The Vendor shall deliver specified product to the City of Beaumont within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of purchase order number. **Purchase order number and delivery address is required and must appear on the delivery ticket and invoice.** Non-stock items shall be delivered within forty-eight (48) hours. Failure to provide within specified time may result in cancellation of order and the City may purchase from another vendor. Three (3) incidents of failure to comply with the stated delivery times may result in termination of the contract. The Vendor shall state hours of operation and/or delivery.

4. FAILURE TO DELIVER

If for any reason the Vendor becomes unable to deliver any product bid, the Vendor will immediately notify the Purchaser so that arrangements can be made for an alternate product or vendor.

5. BRAND NAME

Bidder shall specify manufacturer and brand of all products to be supplied to Purchaser and manufacturer's published specifications for each product to be supplied must accompany the bid. Oil must be a branded product.

6. **AMERICAN PETROLEUM INDUSTRY**

All products shall meet the American Petroleum Industry (API) standards.

7. **REPACKAGED PRODUCTS ARE PROHIBITED**

Should it be determined that repackaged products are being furnished, the contract may be terminated. The term **repackaged** is taken to mean any product whose contents are packaged by someone other than the manufacturer of the contents. Manufacturers drum label shall be intact and legible. Label code shall indicate origin and date of production. Example: Texaco products must be packaged at the Texaco refinery. Products purchased in bulk and packaged by an authorized distributor are consider repackaged and will **not** be accepted.

8. **MANUFACTURER'S WARRANTY**

Lubricants supplied shall be manufactured primarily from Class II virgin base stocks and shall not contain re-refined materials. A printed copy of the Manufacturer's Warranty must accompany the bid. The guarantee shall cover all products offered and shall assume financial responsibility for damage to any parts or components resulting from the use of the product(s).

9. **MANIFEST AND CERTIFICATE OF AUTHENTICITY**

All requests for engine oil, hydraulic oil, and transmission fluid will be delivered **in bulk quantities of 250 gallons or more, 55 gallon drums, or individual size containers, as specified per product**. Drums and individual size containers shall be packaged by the manufacturer of the contents. All bulk deliveries shall be accompanied by a manifest identifying the product, source, and type of the delivered lubricant and a Certificate of Authenticity. Bulk products may not be altered after leaving the manufacturer. **The City has two (2) metered tanks, onsite, that are used for bulk delivery storage, for requests that will require tank truck delivery and pumping.**

10. **DRUM INVENTORY**

A monthly copy of drum inventory shall be supplied to The City. Drum deposit charges shall be carried un-billed until the end of the contract period.

11. **SAFETY DATA SHEET**

The Vendor shall submit one (1) copy of a Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for each chemical or product used. Should a new product be introduced during the term of the contract, copies of the SDA shall be provided to the Fleet Division and Transit Department.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. BULK OILS / LUBRICANTS ENGINE OIL SAE 15W-40

* SYNTHETIC BLEND ONLY *

- 1.1 Shall be suitable for use in both gasoline and diesel engines (15W-40 only).
- 1.2 Shall meet or exceed performance requirements of domestic gasoline and diesel engine manufacturers.
- 1.3 Shall meet or exceed the performance requirements of the latest American Petroleum Institute (API) category CJ-4/SM as well as earlier heavy duty engine categories. In addition, must meet GM Dexos and Ford WSS-M2C913-A requirements. Meet Detroit Diesel 93K218 and 93K215, Mack EO-O Premium Plus 07, Caterpillar ECF-3, ACEA E-5 and E-7, Cummins CES 20081, Mercedes Benz 228.31 and the latest Volvo VDS-r requirements. Meet or exceed Allison C-4, MIL-PRF-2104-G, John Deere and MAN 3275. Be recommended for naturally aspirated, turbocharged or EGR equipped diesel engines.
- 1.4 Shall have a minimum TBN (Total Base Number) of 10.0 measured by ASTM method D2896. And have a Nominal ash content <1.4.

2. ENGINE OIL SAE 40

- 2.1 Shall be suitable for use in two stroke cycle diesel engines.
- 2.2 Shall meet or exceed performance requirements of two stroke cycle diesel engine manufacturers.
- 2.3 Shall meet or exceed former API Service Classification CF-2 on SAE 40 engine oil.
- 2.4 Shall have a minimum TBN (Total Base Number) of 8.0 measured by ASTM method D2896.

3. MULTI-PURPOSE TRANSMISSION / HYDRAULIC OIL

- 3.1 Shall be a multipurpose fluid recommended for combustion transmission-differential, final drive, wet brakes, hydraulic, and hydrostatic systems as specified by most equipment manufacturers.
- 3.2 Shall contain rust and oxidation inhibitor and a foam suppressant.

- 3.3 Shall meet or exceed specifications for case MS1206 (TCH Fluid), MS1207 (HYTRAN Plus Fluid), Ford M2C134C (Hydraulic Fluid), Caterpillar TO-2 (Transmission/Drive Train oil), and John Deere HY-GARD (Transmission and Hydraulic oil).
- 3.4 Shall be suitable for use in axial piston, gear, and rotary vane pumps as manufactured by Denison, Racine, Vickers Commercial Intertech, and others.

4. AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION FLUIDS – DEXRONS AND MERCONS

- 4.1 Shall meet or exceed the specification requirements for: General Motors, Dexron III, Ford Mercon 5, Allison C4 Fluid.
- 4.2 Dexron III-Multi-purpose Automatic Transmission Fluid that, at a minimum, meets the requirements of Allison C-4, Allison TES-389, Caterpillar TO-2 Transmissions.
- 4.3 Dexron VI- Full Synthetic Automatic Transmission Fluid for use in General Motors Passenger Car and Light Truck applications. Meets GMW16444 Original Equipment Specifications.
- 4.4 Mercon V- Automatic Transmission and power steering fluid; Must meet MERCON V License no. M5091101 Standards.
- 4.5 Mercon LV- Automatic Transmission fluid; must meet MERCON LV License no. MLV070701 Standards.
- 4.6 Mercon ULV- Automatic Transmission fluid; must meet MERCON ULV License no. MULV16070 Standards.
- 4.7 Mercon SP- Automatic Transmission fluid; must meet MERCON SP Registration no MSP020201 Standards.

5. ANTIFREEZE / COOLANTS

- 5.1 Fleetguard Complete Pre Mix Coolant (50/50) - Cummins approved 14603 and 14439 approved. Also, must meet the requirements of other OEMs. Meets or exceeds all fully formulated heavy duty specifications including: TMC RP-329, TMC RP-338, ASTM D-6210, ASTM D-3306 and SAE J1941.
- 5.2 Ford DSL Coolant (Orange/Yellow) Concentrate - For use in Ford vehicles requiring antifreeze meeting Ford Specification WSS-M97B57-A1. Must meet or exceed ASTM D 3306.
- 5.3 Dex-Cool Coolant (Orange) Concentrate – AC Delco Extended life coolant that must meet GMW3420 Standards. Must meet or exceed ASTM D3306 and ASTM D4985.

5.4 Antifreeze, Low Silicate (Green) Concentrate – For use in cars, light duty and heavy duty trucks. Must meet ASTM D3306 and ASTM D4985.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF BIDDING
(Revised 3/11/24)

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF BIDDING MAY RESULT IN THE BID BEING DISQUALIFIED.

1. BIDDING

- A. All formal and informal bids or proposals must be on blank forms furnished by the Purchasing Division. The bid must be executed personally by the bidder, or if executed by an agent, a power of attorney or other evidence of his authority to act on behalf of the bidder must accompany the bid. If the bidder is a corporation, the certificate of corporate bidder must be executed under the corporate seal by some duly authorized officer of the corporation other than the officers signing the bid. By execution of the bid, the bidder accepts all general and special conditions of the contract and the specifications.
- B. DATE & TIME: Formal and informal bids or proposals must be completed and submitted through the City of Beaumont's e-bids platform at <https://beaumonttexas.ionwave.net/Login.aspx> by the date and time posted online. Bid or proposal submittals will not be accepted manually in any other format unless otherwise specified. Bids must be submitted only on forms provided by the City, unless otherwise specified.
- C. WITHDRAWAL OF BID: A bidder/proposer may withdraw his bid/proposal before Council acceptance of his bid/proposal without prejudice to himself, by submitting a written request for its withdrawal to the contact person listed within the bid/RFP specifications.
- D. Bids should show net prices, extensions and net total. In case of conflict between unit price and extensions, the unit price will govern.
- E. No change in price will be considered after bids have been opened.
- F. Unless otherwise specified, any catalog or manufacturer's reference or brand name used in describing an item is merely descriptive, and not restrictive, and is used only to indicate type, style or quality of material desired. If a bidder quotes on an article other than the one specified, which he considers comparable, the name and grade of said article must be specified in the bid and sufficient specifications and descriptive data must accompany same to permit thorough evaluation. In the event that deliveries of the supplies covered in the proposal are not made within the number of days specified, or in the event that the supplies delivered are rejected, and are not removed and replaced within the number of days specified in the official notice of rejection, the City reserves the right to purchase said supplied in the open market. Upon any such breach of contract, the City reserves the right to proceed against the successful bidder and/or the surety on this bond for any and all damages occasioned by the breach.

6. **REJECTIONS**

- A. Articles not in accordance with samples and specifications must be removed by the bidder at his expense. All disputes concerning quality of supplies delivered under this proposal will be determined by the City Purchasing Manager or his/her designated representative.
- B. All articles enumerated in the proposal shall be subject to inspection or delivery by an officer designated for the purpose and if found inferior to the quality called for, or not equal in value to the department's samples, or deficient in weight, measurements, workmanship or otherwise, this fact shall be certified to the Purchasing Manager who shall have the right to reject the whole or any part of the same.

7. **BILLING**

- A. All bills are subject to approval by the Purchasing Manager.

8. **PATENTS**

- A. The contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City, the Purchasing Manager, and his/her assistants from all suits and actions of every nature and description brought against it or any of them, for or on account of the use of patented appliances, products or processes, and he shall pay all royalties and charges which are legal and equitable. Evidence of such payment or satisfaction shall be submitted, upon request of the Purchasing Manager, as a necessary requirement in connection with the final estimate for payment in which such patented appliances, products or processes are used.

9. **CONDITIONS PART OF BID**

- A. The General Conditions of Bidding defined herein shall be a part of the attached bid.

10. **CONTRACT**

- A. No formal contract will be executed. The following will comprise the contract between the City and the successful bidder:
- i. Invitation to Bid,
 - ii. General Specifications,
 - iii. General Conditions of Bidding,
 - iv. The Bid Sheet(s),
 - v. Resolution awarding the bid,
 - vi. Award Letter.

In some cases, in addition to the items listed above, a formal contract may be executed between the City and vendor.

- B. In case of conflict, the specifications shall be controlling.

11. **OSHA REQUIREMENTS**

- A. The vendor or contractor hereby guarantees to the City of Beaumont, Texas, that all material, supplies and equipment as listed on the proposal, contract or Purchase Order meets the requirements, specifications and standards as provided for under the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended and in force at the date hereof.

12. **BIDS**

- A. Bids must remain firm for thirty (30) days from the bid opening date to allow for award by Council, unless otherwise specified.

13. **DISCOUNTS**

- A. Prompt payment discounts will be considered in making the award provided the period of the discount offered is sufficient to permit payment within such period in the regular course of business (minimum 10 days). Prompt payment discounts will not be considered for contract purchases.
- B. In connection with any discount offered, time will be computed from the date of receipt of supplies or services or from the date a correct invoice is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed to be made on the date of mailing of the check or electronic funds transfer (EFT).

14. **DISCLOSURE FORMS**

- A. **All required forms must be signed and returned with your bid submittal.**

15. **EXCEPTIONS**

- A. If exceptions are being taken to any part of specifications, have them listed separately on your letterhead and manually sign it.

16. **LOCAL BIDDER CONSIDERATION**

- A. Should bids for goods and/or commodities be received from a local vendor and an out of town vendor, a sales tax impact analysis formula shall be applied to the local vendor's bid. If it is determined by its formula that the local vendor's bid generates more sales tax revenue to the City than the difference between the two bids, award may be made to the local vendor.

17. **PROTEST PROCEDURES**

Any actual or prospective bidder or proposer who believes they are aggrieved in connection with or pertaining to a bid or proposal may file a protest. The protest must be delivered in writing to the Purchasing Manager, in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested, prior to award. The written protest must include:

- A. Name, mailing address, and business phone number the protesting party;
- B. Appropriate identification of the bid or proposal being protested including name of bid and bid number;
- C. A precise statement of the reasons for the protest; and
- D. Any documentation or other evidence supporting the protest and any alleged claims.

The Purchasing Division will attempt to resolve the protest, including at the Purchasing Manager's option, meeting with the protesting party. If the protest is successfully resolved by mutual agreement, written verification of the resolution, with specifics on each point addressed in the protest, will be forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer (CFO).

If the Purchasing Division is not successful in resolving the protest, the protesting party may request, in writing, that the protest be considered by the CFO. Applicable documentation and other information applying to the protest will be forwarded to the CFO, who will promptly review such documentation and information. If additional information is desired, the CFO may notify the necessary party or parties to the protest to provide such information.

If the CFO is not successful in resolving the protest, the CFO may forward to the City Manager a request for review. The decision of the City Manager will be final.

18. **PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT**

- A. Texas Government Code, Chapter 552, gives you the right to access government records; and an officer for public information and the officer's agent may not ask why you want them. All government information is presumed to be available to the public. Certain exceptions may apply to the disclosure of the information. Governmental bodies shall promptly release requested information that is not confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision, or information for which an exception to disclosure has not been sought.

19. **WEBSITE**

20. **INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

Successful bidder agrees to extend prices to all entities who have entered into or will enter into joint purchasing interlocal cooperation agreements with the City of Beaumont. The City of Beaumont is a participating member of several interlocal cooperative purchasing agreements, as permitted under Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, with certain other political subdivision, authorizing participation in a cooperative purchasing program. The successful vendor may be asked to provide products/services based upon the bid price, to any other participant.

21. **FORCE MAJEURE**

Neither the City nor the Contractor shall be required to perform any term, condition or covenant of this contract so long as performance is delayed or prevented by force majeure.

22. **FUNDING OUT**

The State of Texas statutes prohibit the obligation and expenditure of public funds beyond the fiscal year for which a budget has been approved. Should, during the term of this contract, funds be withdrawn by the funding authority, a Force Majeure shall be deemed to exist, and this contract may be terminated without penalty or recourse by either party.

23. **TERMINATION**

This contract may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days' written notice.

Local Vendor Preference Policy and Forms

CITY OF BEAUMONT
LOCAL BIDDER PREFERENCE POLICY

Revised 4/1/13

I. PURPOSE

The Local Government Code, Sections 271.905(a) and 271.9051 allow the City to consider a vendor's principal place of business in awarding certain contracts by way of competitive bids. This consideration is in effect to promote economic development opportunities through the contract by employing local residents and increasing tax revenue.

Local Bidder Preference, as defined herein, will only be considered when a qualified low bidder is not a "local business" and a Local Bidder Consideration Claim form has been submitted by a "local business", in accordance with policy guidelines outlined below.

II. DEFINITIONS

A. Local Business:

1. Vendor whose principal place of business is currently within the limits of the City of Beaumont.
2. Vendor who has been in business within the city limits for at least two (2) years.
3. At least 15% of employees are Beaumont residents.

B. Principal Place of Business: A business must:

1. Currently own or lease a commercial building or space within the corporate city limits of Beaumont.
2. Have owned or leased a commercial building or space within the corporate city limits of Beaumont for a minimum of two (2) years.
3. At least 25% of the entity's inventory and workforce must be regularly based at the owned or leased location. In addition, a substantial role in the entity's performance of a commercially useful function or a substantial part of its operations must be conducted at this location. A location utilized solely as a post office box, mail drop or telephone message center and without any substantial work function or inventory, if applicable, does not qualify.

C. Local Bidder Consideration Claim Form: Form that must be completed and included with the bid response on which the business certifies the location of the business activities, number of current employees and number of residents employed, annual taxable sales, whether current on property and sales taxes, and the economic development benefits resulting from award of this contract.

III. GENERAL PROCEDURES

- A. Bids for purchase of tangible personal property where the amount is equal to or greater than \$500,000: If the City receives one or more bids from a bidder that is a “local business” and whose bid is within three percent (3%) of the lowest bid price received by the City from a bidder who is not a “local business”, the City may enter into a contract with:
- (a) the lowest responsible bidder, or
 - (b) the “local business” if a Local Bidder Consideration Claim Form has been submitted and all requirements have been met and it is determined that the bid is the best combination of price and economic development opportunity and value. The City may also reject all bids.
- B. Competitive Sealed Bids for purchase of construction services, where the amount is less than \$100,000 and for purchase of tangible personal property and services where the amount is less than \$500,000: If the City receives one or more bids from a bidder that is a “local business” and whose bid is within five percent (5%) of the lowest bid price received by the City from a bidder who is not a “local business” the City may enter into a contract with:
- (a) the lowest bidder, or
 - (b) the “local business” if a Local Bidder Consideration Claim Form has been submitted and all requirements of a “principal place of business” have and it is determined that the bid is the best combination of price and economic development opportunity and value. The City may also reject all bids.
- C. Exclusions: Purchases obtained through:
- (a) Request for Proposals, Quotes, or Qualifications,
 - (b) Cooperative Purchasing Programs,
 - (c) Interlocal Agreements, and
 - (d) Purchases involving, in whole or in part, federal funding or state funding.
 - (e) Telecommunications services.

- D. The chart below is a summary of the proposed procedure:

B. Bids for tangible personal property and services less than \$500,000	

- E. Local Bidder Consideration Claim Form: A new form must be submitted with each competitive bid response. Late forms will not be accepted. The form serves to notify the City that the bidder would like local preference consideration and to ensure the qualification of the bidder as a local business and serves to meet the statute's requirement that the governing body find, in writing, that a bidder is a local business. This form shall be obtained from the Purchasing Division and shall be signed under penalty of perjury. **Failure to provide Local Bidder Consideration Claim Form at the time the bidder submits the bid shall constitute a waiver of any claim for preference.**
- F. Approval by governing body: Regardless of the amount, the City Council must approve all purchases and contracts in which the local preference policy is applied. The Local Bidder Consideration Claim form will be included with the agenda item for consideration.

The City of Beaumont has determined that the allowable preference shall be applied to local vendor bids for the purposes of evaluation when in the best interest of the City to do so. Exclusions to the local preference include those purchases that are: sole-source, emergency, federally-funded, cooperative contracts, Requests for Quote or Proposal, or via interlocal Agreement as well as telecommunication services. The City reserves the right to accept or reject any bid or combination of bids.

The City requires the information below for consideration of a local bidder preference. (Information may be submitted in an attachment to this form.)

1) Location Eligibility: Principal place of business in Beaumont, Texas. Principal place of business is defined herein as: Business must own or lease a commercial building or space within the corporate city limits of Beaumont, which is used as a home base for 25% or more of its inventory and workforce. Business must be in operation for at least two (2) years. A location utilized solely as a post office box, mail drop, or telephone message center, and without any substantial work function or inventory, does not qualify.
